Lunch Concern

Students are ***not allowed*** to share lunches at ***any*** grade level. Please speak with your son or daughter to be sure they are not trading or taking items that others are not eating. I realize it goes against the grain when we are trying to teach our kids to share in other ways. Many times they are simply trying to be nice to another student, but it can cause several problems:

- Food allergies are a very important reason not to share food. Parents take time to make sure their son or daughter has what they can eat, and we do not want them getting something that can harm them.
- Health and hygiene is another reason. With colds and flu going around, we do not want a child sneezing and then handing part of their sandwich to another student.
- Undue peer pressure can also sometimes happen. Students feel pressured to share when perhaps they want to eat everything they bought from Campus Cuisine or brought from home. They are made to feel guilty for not sharing.

We do not want any of our students suffering in any of these ways. Please instruct your child if they pack a lunch to bring enough so they are not asking others. If they forget their lunch, they need to come to the office and call a parent/guardian. Wanting something other than what they brought is a natural inclination for kids, so I hope that having this rule will help them to keep that in check. Forgetfulness is also a part of life. If this happens, it is OK. They just need to come to the office so we can call.
