Upon returning the first week of school in August, each student is to turn in a poster project advertising ONE of the books. The poster size should be about 14" by 22", half the size of a large piece of poster board that can be purchased at Walmart, CVS, Target, etc. for less than a dollar. On it should be the title, author, and a short summary of the story without telling the ending. This poster should be like an advertisement to entice other students to want to read the book. Be sure to have colorful illustrations (hand drawn) of scenes or symbols significant to the story. For the other book that is read, I will have the students fill out a book report form in class the first week of school.
